#### Welcome to the June edition of On the Pier.

I was asked by the General Committee to put together this edition of **On the Pier** and in particular to draw the attention of our members to some of the problems the committee are facing and trying to resolve. Leaving aside, for now, the problems of Covid, the most important issues are recruiting committee members, including Officers to ensure continuity and succession and more generally to recruit volunteers to help with the running of the club.

In the past we have managed to have a succession with respect to Vice Commodore, Commodore and Rear Commodore, the Vice Commodore replacing Commodore and the retiring Commodore taking the Rear Commodore position. This allows for stability and continuity on the committee in these important leadership roles. Between now and the AGM the Committee will be encouraging members to consider putting their name forward for the committee for next year.
